CAMPUS CODE OF CONDUCT FOR STUDENTS Ramananda College, Bishnupur, Bankura

- Students are expected to maintain the highest standards of discipline and dignified manner of behavior inside as well as outside the College campus. They shall abide by the rules and regulations of the College and should act in a way that highlights the discipline and esteem of the College.
- 2. All the students are expected to be present in the class well within time. Students should standup to show respect to the teacher when the teacher enters the class room and remain standing till the teacher takes her/his seat or they are allowed by the teacher to sit. Silence shall be observed during class hours. No student shall enter or leave the class room when the session is on without the permission of the teacher concerned.
- Teachers shall be greeted appropriately with "Good Morning Sir/Madam" or "Good Afternoon Sir/ Madam" and a "Thank you Sir/Madam" when the teacher leaves the class room.
- All students shall leave the classes immediately after the classes are over. No students shall wander or gather in verandah, corridor, and staircase etc. They should not spend much time in canteen, coffee shops etc.
- All the students are expected to attend college functions, seminars and conferences and be present for the entire session.
- All the students shall wear their identity cards, well displayed. Identity badge is a public document and
 any teaching staff and non-teaching staff shall have the right to peruse it. Denial of that alone invites
 disciplinary action.
- All kinds of tattooing, body piercing, hair styling etc. that goes against the existing social norms will be referred to the discipline committee. Any dresscode violation noticed within the campus could initiate further disciplinary actions.
- Students are expected to maintain silence in the academic buildings to maintain the decorum and, any deviant behavior such as hooting, whistling, loitering etc. will be treated as an instance of indiscipline.
- For independent study, students are expected to use the class rooms, library or the demarcated areas of the academic building and shall not resort to sitting in staircases or circulation areas where they could interfere with the free movement.
- 10. Students are encouraged to make use of the library, common computing facilities and to involve inprofessional body activities or any program authorized by the college beyond class hours. However under normal circumstances students shall retreat to their hostels or residences by 6.00 PM.
- Students are expected to keep the campus neat and clean. They should not put any waste anywhere in the campus except in the waste baskets.
- Consumption of intoxicants / psychotropic substances in any form or smoking or using chewinggum, panmasala etc. are strictly prohibited inside the campus.
- 13. It is strongly advised to refrain from activities such as scribbling or noting on walls, door or furniture which could deface the college and destroy the academic embiance.
- 14. One should carefully handle the furniture, equipment, fixtures and appliances of the college and laboratory. Careless handling/misuse of the above could result personal injuries or damage to property. Follow safety precautions near moving machines and electrical installations. In the event of damage of property, the responsible students will have to bear the cost of replacement/repair with fine.

- 15. At Intervals or free periods, students are normally allowed to go to the girls'/boys' common Rooms for playing indoor games like Table Tennis, Carrom etc.
- Students are not permitted to arrange any unauthorized celebrations and decorations of any magnitude in the campus.
- Students are not permitted to distribute or display (both physically and electronically) material such as notices, banners etc. in the campus without the permission of the competent authority.
- 18. Students are expected to make use of academic, co-curricular and extracurricular facilities available to the optimum levels. This will certainly make them physically fit, academically competent, mentally alert and socially sensitive.
- 19. Students who intend to represent the college in intercollegiate events shall take prior permission from the concerned head of the department and the selection will be based on parameters such asacademic performance, attendance, character and competence of thestudent in the proposed event for participation.
- Unauthorized meetings, propaganda work, processions or fund collections are forbidden within the College, hostels, and outside the college.
- Harassing juniors, ill treatment to other fellow students or any such form of ragging is objectionable
 and liable to be treated as criminal offence by the law enforcing agencies as per the directives of
 Hon'ble Supreme Court of India.
- Misbehavior towards girl students, use of threat or violence against members of the staff or fellow students will be considered as very serious cases of misconduct.
- Any violation of the above rules will invite penalty in the form of warning, fine, bringing of parents or any course of corrective measure as found suitable by any staff member or higherauthority of the College.

Mobile Phone Policy:

The purpose of this policy is to establish clear cut guidelines regarding the usage of mobile phones inside the campus. This policy is applicable to the students who enter inside the college campus. Realizing the importance of communication and the possible impact of mobile phone usage inside the campus, the following guidelines are arrived at:

- Students are not permitted for using mobile phones without enough cause, within the campus.
 However, use of phones for academic purposes is allowed if prior permission from a teacher has been taken. The mobile phones must be kept in silent mode during the class hours.
- Accessing Social Networking Sites such as Facebook, Whatsapp, Twitter etc. is prohibited within the college campus, however access to these sites are permitted in hostel building during time slots specified by the hostel wardens.

AN INTRODUCTION

Ramananda College is a pioneering higher-educational institution located at Bishnupur, within the district of Bankura. It is the sole co-educational Degree College with PG courses recognized by the UGC within Bishnupur town. Since its inceptionin 1945, this institution has been serving the cause of higher education in the local community and also of students from far-away, remote villages. Even today students from other districts are studying here.

Sri Ramnalini Chakraborty, freedom-fighter and social worker of Bishnupur, Sri Radhagobinda Roy, Founder-Principal of this college and ex-minister, Govt. of West Bengal and other eminent community members of Bishnupur decided to establish a college here. Sri Ramnalini Chakraborty, the Koley family, Sri Anil Kumar Bhattacharya, members of the Friends' Union Club and the community maximally funded the costs for building this college. The college is named after the son of the soil, Sri Ramananda Chattopadhyay (1865-1943), journalist, editor and scholar who was active during the Bengal Renaissance.

Initially the college was affiliated to the University of Calcutta and later, to the University of Burdwan and now under the affiliation of the Bankura University since 1st January, 2017. The college is recognized by the UGC under Sections 2f and 12B. As the college was established before Independence, it predates both the creations of the UGC and the University of Burdwan. In 2015, the National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC) re-accredited (2nd cycle) the College with 2.75 score. Further, with the introduction of different Post Graduate Courses in Science and Humanities, the college has become a constituent college of the BankuraUniversity. Now the college is complaint with the visions of RUSA.

INFRASTRUCTURE

- College Campus: Our College is a partially residential one with a total campus area of 37,635.82sq.m. Apart from the college main building and other academic blocks, housing different departments, the college campus accommodates three students' hostels, a spacious auditorium "BiramBhavan", a museum, a playground, students' health home, office of the Students' Union and staff quarters. There are two canteens within the college premises for teachers, students and members of non-teaching staff. The college has hygienic toilet blocks, gymnasium, cycle stands, students' common rooms (separate for boys and girls), gardens (flowers & medicinal plants), CCTV Survellance facility computerized library and office with internet facility.
- Library: The library is located in the ground floor with separated reading room for students and teachers. The Library is well ventilated, lighted and aired to facilitate comfortable seating. The Library is fully computerized and performing functions like issue, return, OPAC search, and availability assessment of books in an easy and user friendly ambience. We have bar-coded our document collections. Our college library contains a rich collection of more than 30000 books, 23 journal / Magazine, 3 Daily Newspapers, 2 Employment oriented Newspapers. Our library subscribes 2 digital database one from N-LIST (UGC-INFONET Digital Library Consortium, INFLIBNET Centre and NDL (National Digital Library, IIT Kharagpur). Library books are well stacked in accordance with Dewey Decimal Classification System. Library Membership is offered to the current students and staff of the college. From the current session a Browsing centre with four computers with internet facilities has been set up in the Central Library.
- Hostels: We have three hostels (one for boys, one for girls and a Swabalambi Chhatrabas, a boys' hostel, for poor and meritorious students) with a total seat capacity of 175. Superintendents look after these hostels, Healthcare services are also provided through Students' Health Home.

· Laboratories: All practical based departments have wellequipped laboratories for the Honours and General practical classes. These laboratories are kept up to date, on a regular basis, according to changing syllabi. A separate laboratory for the P.G. Department (M.Sc.inBotany) is maintained. The college has also a 'Central Instrumentation Facility' with a number of modern and scientific instruments. A new computer laboratory for the Mathematics Department and a digital laboratory for Computer Science Department have been established.

Computer, Internet facilities & other modern teaching aids:

At present there are 156 computers and laptops, distributed in the office, library and academic departments, Students, teachers and office staff use the internet. Modern audio-visual teaching aids like LCD-projector, overhead projector, computerized epidiascope, etc. are also used in teaching. All academic departments, the office, library and the students' union office are well connected through intercom telephone services. The college has one virtual class room with teleconference facility to different University and colleges and nine smart class rooms. The college has its own well designed website: www.ramanandacollege.org

- NCC: The College has a functional NCC unit, the 53 Bengal Battalion. The NCC training is conducted on Tuesday. There are both male and female cadets with separate units.
- ♦ NSS: Ramananda College currently has two NSS units: Unit I and Unit-II. Regular NSS activities are organized on Sunday and NSS classes are conducted in the middle of the week within class hours. "One Day State Level Seminar on Environmental Awareness" has been organized by NSS, Ramananda College on 20th December, 2018. Special NSS camps are organized in the adopted villages yearly. This year seven days special NSS camp (University level) was held in Pansiuli & Mansa Village, Bishnupur, from 14th to 20th March, 2019. An awareness camp on thalassemia was organized by NSS units on 14th March, 2019 and a medical camp for detection of thalassemia among the college students was organized by NSS units and Students' Welfare Committee of the College on 20th March, 2019. Other programmes on different social issues are held throughout the year.
- Biodiversity Management Committee: A Biodiversity Management Committee under West Bengal Biodiversity Board has been established from the Academic session 2018-19, in this College under the supervision of Dr. Ajit Kumar Dutta, Associate Professor in Botany, Ramananda College. As an initiative to make the environment of the college eco-friendly, the college observes NO FUEL DAY on 12th and 25th of each month.





- Radha Gobinda Memorial Students' Health Home: The College has a students' health centre
 adjacent to the football ground. It is a branch of Students' Health Home, Kolkata and the main centre of this
 Sub-Division.
- Other facilities: The College has Special Study Centres / Distance Education of IGNOU and NSOU which offer professional & job-oriented programmes along with conventional courses. Rain water harvesting project has been started with the financial help from Environment Science Departments, Govt. of West Bengal to meet the need for water to be used by the students of Swabalambi hostel. There are four electrical generator sets in the campus if emergencies arise. Selected students are provided with sports goods for participation in Inter-University and State Level competitions. The college has a well-equipped gymnasium-hall and 'Annasatra' for meager students. Very recent five PG courses in Science and Huminaties introduced in our college is running smoothly.

ACADEMIC STANDARDS AND RESULTS

Duly qualified teachers, appointed through the College Service Commission (CSC), West Bengal, in association with the non-teaching staff are engaged in serving the college, Part- time teachers and Guest teachers are also appointed to meet the needs of the students. Each year some students obtain University ranks and a good number of them secure First Classes in the University Final Examinations. In the last academic session (2017-2018), 53 Hons, students secured First Class in the University Final UG Examinations: Bengali - 06, Nutrition - 10, Physics - 06, Chemistry - 02, Geography - 05, Philosophy- 01, Zoology- 03, Physiology- 05, Mathematics - 04, Botany- 03, History - 01, Sanskrit - 01, Commerce - 01, Education - 02 and three (03) General degree students (Each one from Botany, Zoology and Physiology) secured first class.

Besides regular teaching and ongoing-assessment activities a number of faculty members are engaged in research. Some of them are invited as resource persons to deliver lectures on selected topics. Different Departments of this college organize seminars (State and National Levels) and workshops. In 2018-19 academic session teachers of this college published 36 papers in National & International Journals and participated in various workshops and seminars including international seminars. For the students & teachers of Humanities & Social Sciences' Departments, there is a Study Circle, Bikshan and for the students & teachers of Science Departments, there is an organization, Vigyan Parishad in the college. The Women Cell and Sexual Harassment Prevention cell play their active roles in the college. Under the newly functional Career Advancement Centre (CAC), the college provides coaching for entry in services to SC, ST, OBC and Minority students. Backward class students can also avail Remedial Coaching in addition to regular class teaching. Spoken English classes have also been started and will be continued under the Career Advancement Centre. A Certificate Course on computer literacy and proficiency has been started from 2019 in this College.

CAREER ADVANCEMENT CENTRE

The Career Advancement Centre (CAC), started its journey since 2016, with a view to train students to develop their professional skills for different competitive examinations and gives information to the students regarding different courses after Graduation and job opportunities in different spheres. Many of our students have got Government jobs in the RPF, BSF, SSC, CSC, and WBCS and in the State police force etc. It has also organized two Grooming programmes with (i) Gillette Guard in association with Anandabazar Partika and (ii) RICE Education. Six (06) Candidates are selected at Tata Consultency Services (TCS) through Academia-Industry Interaction in the year 2018-2019.

Affarmative Action Training Programme is imparted by TCS, It comes under CSR project. In it students are given free TCS employability training for 100hrs followed by written test and personal interview. Under this employability training they focus on those students who have graduated or are in final year of graduation and who are not financially sound. They mainly focussed on ST, SC and OBC students from rural background. Through this training many students have been placed & are well settled. CSR (corporate social responsibility) training programme with 'ankur bikash kendra' and Bishnupur Nagarik Mancha, in organized in January 2019.

EXPANSION & DIVERSIFICATION

We have introduced job oriented vocational courses. The CAC is a step in that direction. New computer center, language lab, smart room and class rooms are constructed under RUSA grant. Our Institution has launched five certificate courses: Food Processing, Modern Handicrafts, Tailoring, Computer Training Course and Yoga. These courses will enrich the learners with some vocational training for generating a sustained income (earning process) in future. Honours in Computer Science and Music have been started from 2018-2019 session. All PG students of this College will be able to get the Coaching for NET, SET and SSC Examinations along with their PG Study from our Institute. Construction of 3 more class rooms is going on.



Important Informations

- Geography at the H.S. level is mandatory to opt for geography in B.Sc. / B.A. General Degree course.
- Students who have studied vocational courses at the plus 2 level are eligible for subject specific General Degree courses. Students qualified from Rabindra Mukta Vidyalaya (Technical courses) are eligible for candidature in different subjects as per the University guidelines.
- Candidature of students belonging to the SC / ST/ OBC/ PH/ VH will be considered as per the Govt, guidelines.
- Principal's decision regarding matters of admission is final. Under all circumstances regarding admission procedure the latest notice issued by the university should be considered final.
- 5. Current students qualifying H.S. and qualified students from last two years are eligible for admission in the first semester. All students, expect for the current batch, will have to mention their previous institution and provide valid transfer and registration certificate before admission. Those who have not been admitted to any college in the previous years will have to provide satisfactory proof. Guardians are required to sign an undertaking.
- 6. All other important notifications will be available at the college notice board.
- Eligible students are required to contract concerning authorities with proper income certificate to apply for concessions.
- No application for change of subject(s) will be entertained after registration / enrollment at the university.
- 9. Admission to M.Sc. / M.A. Course is under the control of the university.
- 10. Attested photocopies of the following documents should be attached with the application form-Marksheet of the last passed examination and Marksheet of the M.P. Examination, Admit Card of Madhyamik Pariksha, School Leaving Certificate and Caste Certificate and PH/VH Certificate, where applicable.
 - All original documents should be produced during verification.
- 11. All students should collect a photo identity card from the college after admission.
- There will Internal Assessments in every semester and the marks of it will be added with marks of each End semester Examination.
- 13. As per University Guidelines students should have 75% attendance and should seat for all the Internal examinations conducted by the college to be eligible to appear at the university examinations or apply for student's concession or scholarship.
- 14. Students should regularly follow the college notice board and fill up forms for registration and enrolment within due date to be eligible to appear at the university examinations.
- 15. The college has NCC and NSS units.
- 16. In case of irregular attendance and other disciplinary matters the college might notify guardians and request them to visit the college.
- Any complaint of ragging in the college campus or college hostel premises will be strictly dealt with proper legal procedures.
- 18. Students should follow the college notice board for notifications about submission of fees.

Regarding students' Hostels:

There are separate hostels with self-messing for boys and girls. Every hostel has a superintendent in

- 1. Capacity of Boys'Hostel 100
- 2. Capacity of Girls'Hostel 75

Approximate Expenditure for staying in hostels:

Hostel seat rent per month is Rs.150/- (12 months i.e. an academic session starting from July to June). Seat rent for Swabalambi Hostel is Rs. 75/- per month. It is to be mentioned here that only economically poor but meritorious students can avail seats in Swabalambi Hostel. Every student has to bear the monthly electricity bill along with the monthly meal charge at the end of the month failing which college authority bears no responsibility for electricity disconnection.

Hostel admission Fees and Rules:

Every boarder has to pay Rs.100/- as admission fee, Rs.200/- as caution money, Rs. 100/- as electricity caution deposit (Total Rs. 400/- Non-refundable) and Rs. 1800/- as seat rent for 12 months at the time of admission. However, Rs. 900/- only is payable as seat rent for staying in Swabalambi Hostel. Mess Management in hostels rests with the Mess Committees elected by the boarders themselves.

Seat allotment for hostels rests with the Principal's sole discretion. Guests of any boarder can stay and avail fooding in hostels only with the prior permission of the principal. Superintendent's directions are always in force in the management of hostels. Breach/violation of rules and regulations regarding hostels attracts severe punishment. Any incident of Ragging is dealt with harsh punishment. Full cooperation of parents/guardians is highly solicited.
